Stakeholder Focus Group Meetings Summary

On March 6th and 7th, Raimi + Associates conducted five stakeholder group meetings with Palmdale industry leaders, educational entities, faith-based organizations, and community-based organizations about issues and opportunities for the Palmdale General Plan Update. Raimi + Associates also separately met with elected officials. The comments received at these meetings

have been categorized into one of four major categories – opportunities, challenges, needs, and examples of desirable, model communities and areas.

HR&A conducted a similar focus group meeting on March 6th regarding economic development in Palmdale. Summary findings of the economic development stakeholder focus group can be found in a separate report.

Opportunities

- Current development interest in Palmdale
- Recent development on Avenue S
- Trade and commerce potential
- Aerospace industry provides good quality jobs locally in Palmdale
- Potential to fill gap in the LA film industry with studio space / editing space
 - Capacity to expand existing city partnerships with FBO, Education, and Aerospace industry;
 including other industries like; healthcare, solar and public sector
- Future Palmdale Regional Airport
- Future High-Speed Rail
- Potential to expand rail service to LA Union Station

- Existing development regulations that hinder new urbanism development
